FASD/Drug Affected

Material Title: **Adoption and Prenatal Alcohol and Drug Exposure: Research, Policy, and Practice**
 Author: Richard P. Barth *Books* 2000 281 pages

This book contains ten extensive essays from a number of experts in the field. It is organized into three major sections: Research on prenatal alcohol and drug exposure and its implications for adoption; programmatic approaches and practice considerations related to serving substance-exposed children and their adoptive families; and policy issues that bear on adoption planning and services for this vulnerable group of children. It is designed as a resource for practitioners, policymakers, researchers, and others with an interest in adoption.

Material Title: **Assessing, Treating and Living with FAS/ARND (VHS)**
 Author: Ed-Net Series *Videotapes* 1996 2 hours

This panel format presents three very knowledgeable individuals—a nationally recognized physician, a social work expert in the field, and an adoptive mother of four alcohol affected children – with special skills in accessing educational resources. (Note: Since taping there was a 1997 change in the Federal statute, Individuals with Disabilities Education Act--IDEA) The physiological issue is the organic brain damage of these children. The frustrating behaviors result from their brains working differently. Their environment must be adapted for improved behavior.

Material Title: **Best I Can Be, The : Living with Fetal Alcohol Syndrome or Effects**
 Author: Liz Kulp *Books* 2000 84 pages

Written by Liz, a teenager exposed prenatally to alcohol, and Liz's adoptive mom, Jodee, this book is packed with information, lists of resources, quotes from others, illustrations, and, most prominently, the story of the mother and her daughter who lived through trials, setbacks, and successes. There are journal entries in Liz's hand and several pages of useful appendixes at the end.

Material Title: **Best of Adopted Child: For Parents Adopting Children Affected by Substance or Sexual Abuse**
 Author: Lois Melina *Journals/Newsletters* 1982 to 1997

This collection of articles from 1982 to 1997 includes pieces on how cocaine and alcohol affect the unborn, hereditary vs. environmental influences on alcoholism, hyperactivity, and the effects and symptoms of sexual abuse.

Material Title: **Best of F.A.S. Times, The**
 Author: FAS *Journals/Newsletters* 1999 146 pages

This book is a compilation of FAS Times articles over the past 10 years. It is divided into 10 chapters relating to FAS/E. Each chapter is composed of articles pertaining to a particular subject such as History of FAS/E, Identification and Diagnosis of FAS/E, Nurture in the Family, Education and the Student with FAS/E, and Safety and Sanity of Parents and Children.

Material Title: **Birds of a Feather Play Together* (Children's Materials)**
 Author: Marilyn Krueger *Children's Books* 2007 63 pages

This booklet, put together through a collaboration between two British Columbia organizations, offers ten illustrated activities – simple assembly projects using household items – with instructions and a brief explanation of each activity's beneficial aspects. It is for parents who want hands-on activities with their physically and/or developmentally delayed young children.

Material Title: **Bruised Before Birth: Parenting Children Exposed to Prenatal Substance Abuse**
 Author: Joan McNamara, et. Al *Books* 1994 115 pages

If you are parenting a drug/alcohol-exposed child, this book will help you to be your child's best advocate. Parents will find a wealth of information, from the technical (how various substances affect the unborn) to the practical (how to cope and answer children's tough questions). Besides being better informed after reading this, parents will come away with a sense of hope about how they can best help children reach their highest potential.

Material Title: **Caring for Drug-Exposed Infants**
Author: Barbara Drennen *Books* 2010 150 pages

In this comprehensive guide for caregivers, Barbara Drennen and Elaine Purchase crystallize the firsthand knowledge Barbara has acquired as the co-founder and Executive Director of Pediatric Interim Care Center (PICC), the nation's only nursery providing specialized, 24-hour care for newborns prenatally exposed to drugs. It is also the story of an extraordinary woman who opened her home to these vulnerable babies and became their champion. Filled with the heartrending stories of the babies, mothers, and families Barbara has met along the way, this book shares the insight of a pioneer who has given thousands of children a safe and healthy start in life.

Material Title: **Caring for Drug-Exposed Infants (DVD)**
Author: DVD *DVDs* 2006 27 minutes

This DVD distills Pediatric Interim Care Center's (PICC) two decades of experience to provide a simple, step-by-step guide to the recognition and therapeutic care of drug-exposed infants. PICC, The Newborn Nursery, is the nation's only 24-hour interim care nursery for drug-exposed newborns. Founded in 1990, this pioneering facility in Kent, Washington, has provided a safe and healthy start in life for thousands of newborns withdrawing from prenatal exposure to heroin, methadone, cocaine, methamphetamine, and dozens of other illicit and prescription drugs.

Material Title: **Challenge of Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, The: Overcoming Secondary Disabilities**
Author: Ann Streissguth and Jonathan Kanter *Books* 1997 250 pages

A summary of recent findings and recommendations is presented by the team who conducted the largest study ever done on people of all ages with Fetal Alcohol Syndrome and Fetal Alcohol Effects. Twenty-two experts from the fields of human services, education, and criminal justice respond by describing their solutions to this problem of a birth defect that targets the brain and has lifelong consequences. This book acknowledges the diverse and multifaceted needs of people with FAS/FAE across the lifespan.

Material Title: **Cheers! Here's to the Baby! A Birth Mother's Discovery of Fetal Alcohol Syndrome**
Author: Linda Belle La Fever *Books* 2000 250 pages

This book reveals the struggles and heartbreaks of a loving single mother who unknowingly made a terrible mistake that forever altered the potential of her youngest son, Danny. She discovered that it was necessary to educate Danny's teachers and other service providers about his birth defect, even though it was the direct result of her consumption of alcohol during pregnancy.

Material Title: **Children with Prenatal Alcohol and/or Other Drug Exposure: Weighing the Risks of Adoption**
Author: Susan Edelstein *Books* 1995 105 pages

The decision to adopt should be made with thought and care; the decision to adopt a child with prenatal drug exposure involves added challenges. Designed primarily for professionals, this book offers practical suggestions for preparing and working with families considering adoption of a child prenatally exposed.

Material Title: **Damaged Angels: An Adoptive Mother Discovers the Tragic Toll of Alcohol in Pregnancy**
Author: Bonnie Buxton *Books* 2004 298 pages

Part heartfelt memoir, part practical guide, Damaged Angels recounts Bonnie Buxton's struggles to raise an adopted daughter whom she didn't realize was afflicted with Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder. This book offers guidance to parents who have children with FASD and can aid and comfort all those affected by it. Foreword by Sterling Clarren, M.D.

Material Title: **Early Years, The: Fetal Alcohol Syndrome Series (VHS)**
Author: Altschul Group *Videotapes* 1997 20 minutes

Early intervention is the key to helping children with F.A.S. or F.A.E. reach their full potential. Diagnosis and the parent's acceptance of the diagnosis can result in major changes in parent-child interactions. The child is not just being contrary. The parent is not a failure. Viewers learn the importance of developing a routine with the child, communicating feelings, playing and preparing the child for school. Experts explain why children with F.A.S./F.A.E. behave in certain ways and offer advice on how to handle typical situations. Material Title: **Eden's Secret Journal: The Story of an Older Child Adoption* (Children's Materials)**
Author: Brenda McCreight *Children's Books* 2003 59 pages

This fictional journal's title character is a 13-year-old, adopted at age 10, who is writing the journal because her therapist told her to. She talks about her years in foster care, her substance abusing birth parents, and her adoptive parents. Her life is far from perfect, but it is getting better and we learn how she feels about things in her world. Author, Brenda McCreight is a Child & family therapist with more than 20 years experience.

Material Title: **Empowering, Connecting and Correcting Principles: Healing Children Through Trust and Relationships (DVD)**

Author: TCU Institute of Child Development *DVDs* 2010 1 hour 55 minutes

In this nearly two-hour presentation, Dr. Karyn Purvis, a developmental psychologist, explains her research-based approach with children who come from what she calls "hard places". These are children who have been exposed to drugs and alcohol in utero or suffered abuse, trauma or neglect early in life. She explains how harm during these critical stages of brain growth cause significant disruption in a child's development and behaviors and offers strategies to overcome these deficits.

Through research and years of experience with children throughout the world, Dr. Purvis offers a path of healing through a trust-based, relationship-based, holistic approach. She explains the principles and tactics for reconnecting with these children to meet their needs and help them reach their highest potential.

Material Title: **Fantastic Antone Grows Up**

Author: Judith Kleinfeld *Books* 2000 361 pages

In this sequel to *Fantastic Antone Succeeds*, young people with FAS/E and their caregivers report on their experiences coping with the problems of adolescence and young adulthood. The editors have concentrated on the wisdom of practice, as they candidly convey which techniques worked and which did not during the difficult passages of the teenage years and beyond.

Material Title: **Fantastic Antone Succeeds: Experiences in Educating Children with Fetal Alcohol Syndrome**

Author: Judith Kleinfeld *Books* 1993 322 pages

Vignettes from parents, teachers and therapists about their experiences with alcohol affected children all point out how these children need to be taught differently and disciplined differently. It offers practical advice about what works and what does not, and it's hopeful, positive and readable and not highly technical.

Material Title: **Fetal Alcohol and Other Drug Effects (4 VHS)**

Author: Diane Malbin *Videotapes* 1999 4 hours

In this four-part series, Diane Malbin discusses many facets of the effects of prenatal exposure to drugs and alcohol and the resultant neurodevelopmental disorder. Using charts and numerous anecdotes, she covers in sequence, "Diagnostic Criteria: Effects of Prenatal Exposure"; "Common Learning and Behavioral Characteristics"; "Behaviors and Overlapping Diagnoses"; and "Barriers to Identification: Historical, Cultural, Professional and Personal."

Material Title: **Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD)**

Author: ORPARC *Information Packets* 2003 8 pages

This 8-page, nuts-and-bolts introduction to fetal alcohol exposure and its effects on children and their families is for those who have little or no knowledge of the disorder and need a basic understanding. It can be a good introduction for teachers, out of home relatives, and others the child comes into regular contact with.

Material Title: **Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder: Reasons, Not Excuses, for Behaviors (3 CDs)**

Author: NACAC Conference *CDs* 8/4/11 hours 45 minutes

This material is a recording of a presentation from the 37th NACAC Conference in August 2011. Presented by Kari Fletcher from the North American Council on Adoptable Children in Minnesota and Eileen Bisgard of NOFAS Colorado. Children with FASD often struggle with behavior. This workshop will explore the connection between brain and behavior in order to help caregivers and professionals develop more effective intervention strategies. Participants also consider the importance of helping the person with FASD learn about their disability and the reason (not excuses!) why they struggle.

Material Title: **Fetal Alcohol Syndrome: A Guide for Families and Communities**

This is a comprehensive look at FAS including a section on the science of FAS, a section on preparing people with FAS for life in the community, a chapter on diagnosis, and a chapter on guidelines for schools.

Dr. Vera Fahlberg talks with a panel of experienced foster parents about the issues of increased drug and alcohol related placements, the importance of communication with birth parents, and the need for early permanency planning. While the discussion focuses primarily on infant and preschool placements, the information on this tape can be applied to the care of foster children of all ages.

This book profiles, through photographs and descriptive biographical sketches, 56 children and adults medically diagnosed with prenatal exposure to alcohol and 35 parents, birth and adoptive, who care for such children. Its goal is to influence physicians and mental health professionals to diagnose every person with this disability (currently, Fetal Alcohol Syndrome is a clinical diagnosis that applies to only a fraction of those with neurological impairment resulting from prenatal exposure to alcohol).

Material Title: **Our FAScinating Journey: Keys to Brain Potential Along the Path of Prenatal Brain Injury**
Author: Jodee Kulp *Books* 2012 200 pages

Our FAScinating Journey will introduce readers to another winding path in working with prenatally exposed children. Jodee illuminates this path with lights that shine the hope of possibilities for these special kids. On your journey through these pages you will: • Discover creative approaches in reaching and loving children with attachment issues. • Understand how alcohol affects the growing brains of children. • Become familiar with brain terminology. • Uncover ideas to help a child nutritionally. • Wade through school and behavior issues with tears, laughter and strategies you may not have tried. • Meet professionals who have helped the Kulp family help Liz grow. • Loose yourself in a myriad of ideas within the appendix. • Smile as you get to know Liz, a very real teen who is determined to be the best she can be inspite of FASD.

Material Title: **Parenting Children Affected by Fetal Alcohol Syndrome: A Guide for Daily Living**
Author: Sara Graefe *Books* 1998 54 pages

This manual from the Society of Special Needs Adoptive Parents in cooperation with the Adoption Council of Canada, provides definitions and facts, common manifestations, common misconceptions, parenting suggestions and guidelines to help parents of children affected by FAS and the professionals who work with them.

Material Title: **Parenting Children Who Have Been Exposed To Methamphetamine**
Author: Claudia Hutchison *Information Packets* 2006 23 pages

This information packet begins with a brief overview of current knowledge regarding the abuse of methamphetamine: what it is, how it effects the user, and how addiction is treated. Part Two contains information about the known and suspected effects on the children of methamphetamine users. It includes both prenatal exposure effects and environmental exposure effects. Part Three offers suggestions for adoptive, guardianship, and foster parents who care for the children from meth abusing homes. Part Four contains reprints of several articles on the topic, written specifically for foster and adoptive parents. Appendix A is a list of recommended resources for more information, and Appendix B contains a list of sources used to compile this information packet.

Material Title: **Parenting the Medically Fragile/Drug Affected Infant (VHS)**
Author: *Videotapes* 2 hours

This video contains significant information regarding the biological history and symptoms of alcohol/ drug affected infants, interventions that can be used with such medically fragile children, and the poignant story of one child impacted for life by the use of alcohol/ drugs during fetal development. The tape consists of an expert talking about these issues, and though the information is accurate and useful, some viewers may not find the presentation very engaging.

Material Title: **Pediatric Disorders of Regulation in Affect and Behavior: A Therapist's Guide to Assessment and Treatment**
Author: Georgia De Gangi Books 2000 334 pages

This book, designed for mental health professionals and occupational therapists working with infants and children, describes in detail, specific treatment approaches for problems of mood regulation, sensory processing, attention, sleep, feeding, and play and social interactions. Comprehensive case presentations are included in each chapter to demonstrate this innovative and integrated treatment approach.

Material Title: **Prenatal Exposure to Drugs/Alcohol**
Author: Jeanette M. Soby Books 2006 149 pages

Divided into three sections, this book for professionals and parents describes the characteristics of youngsters affected by prenatal drug/alcohol exposure and explores strategies to circumvent this damage in order to maximize the individual's remaining strengths. Part 3 describes instructional strategies for the learning and everyday life experiences that these children find challenging.

Material Title: **Raising Resilient Rascals 2008: Disc 3 (DVD)**
Author: DVD DVDs 2008 3 hours

This disk includes the following presentations from the 2008 conference: "Interventions for the Fetal Alcohol Spectrum" with Julia Bledsoe; "Psychiatric Medication Treatments and Their Place in Adoption Medicine" with Margaret Cashman; and a Sleep Discussion & Panel led by Margaret Cashman.

Material Title: **Reach to Teach: Educating Elementary and Middle School Children with Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders**
Author: Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Admin *Non-Return Items* 2007 51 pages

Reach To Teach is a resource guide for parents of a child with an FASD and for teachers in elementary and middle schools who work with children who have an FASD. It provides a basic introduction to these disorders and tools to improve communication between parents and teachers. You can download a copy at www.ncadi.samhsa.gov.

Material Title: **Reaching Out To Children With FAS/FAE**
Author: Diane Davis Books 1994 198 pages

Written specifically for those who parent, teach or counsel children with fetal alcohol syndrome and fetal alcohol effects. It discusses causes, the diagnosis of FAS/FAE, and characteristics commonly seen in these kids. It also offers hands-on techniques for establishing guidelines at home and school.

Material Title: **Recognizing and Managing Children with Fetal Alcohol Syndrome/Fetal Alcohol Effects: A Guidebook**
Author: Brenda McCreight Books 1997 153

For any parent or professional who needs to work with children with fetal alcohol syndrome/effects (FAS/E), this important guide offers practical advice and solid information on dealing with FAS/E's lifelong effects on behavior and learning. It covers the historical, medical, and social aspects of FAS/E, and details common behavioral characteristics associated with the condition. Taking a developmental approach, the guide offers specific behavioral management techniques to be used with children with FAS/E from infancy through late adolescence. The author's own case studies are used to clarify psychological concepts and personalize FAS/E for the novice.

Material Title: **School Years, The: Fetal Alcohol Syndrome Series (VHS)**
Author: Altschul Group Videotapes 1997 20 minutes

This program concentrates on the importance of meeting the needs of children with F.A.S. at both the classroom and school district levels. It stresses that students with F.A.S. or F.A.E. are not necessarily mentally retarded but may process information differently. Practical ways of helping these children learn despite their differences are presented. Parents, teachers and other experts offer their views on the importance of getting to know the child's teachers and educating them about the child's needs. Useful for parents and teachers alike.

Material Title: **Scrabble Rabble (DVD)**
Author: DVD DVDs 2008 30 minutes.

This DVD is a filmed stage performance in which four actors portray scenarios from "The Game of Life" as though it were a TV game show. It is surreal, funny, sad, and pretty telling about the world of prenatal exposure to alcohol. It demonstrates the dangers of drinking and sex, and the difficulties kids and their parents experience as a result of such exposure.

Material Title: **Storm Riders: A Novel**
Author: Craig Lesley *Books* 2000 339 pages

This novel from the acclaimed Portland novelist follows the challenges and tragedies of Clark Woods, a foster parent who is raising a Native American son, Wade. From the outset it is clear that Wade, born with Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, is not only disabled but disturbed. It vividly portrays a father and a son struggling to come to terms with each other and endeavoring, above all, to come to terms with the truth.
