bags, sleeping bag liners, mattress pads and use of a camp stove for the weekend at no extra cost. There are 12 weekend events scheduled at various state parks. Campers can choose to arrive on Friday afternoon after 4:00 p.m. or by 10:00 a.m. on Saturday morning when activities begin. Events end by 12:00 noon on Sunday. One vehicle is allowed per family. There is an event focused on Latino families held at Nehalem Bay state park on July 25-27.

These are very secure events with ranger-led activities, staff members and trained volunteers on hand to assist you around the clock. These events have been very popular with single parents, families on a budget, and seniors. The cost for the entire family is \$30 for the weekend. Pre-registration and payment are required.
